Welcome to Pagosa Springs!

On behalf of our community, we want to welcome you to the October CAST meeting! We have a great agenda, good food, and something a little different. Pagosa Springs is home to the San Juan Shootists, a registered Chapter of the Cowboy Fast Draw Association and home to the 2016 U.S. National Championships and we are issuing a challenge to all to a Cowboy Fast Draw Match! They have offered to hold a timed match for CAST at NO COST! How Does It Work?

Targets

First of all you shoot at targets – not at each other! The standard target is a 24" round disc with a starter light in the middle. The target is about 50" above the ground and is coated with lithium white grease to track hits to the target. In addition, digital timers are used to track scoring to the thousandth of a second. We'll shoot from about 15' away.

Equipment

All equipment is provided and consists of western style holster and single-action .45 Colt caliber revolver pistols. The ammunition that is fired is a low-powered shotgun primer and wax pellet bullets.

Clothing

The Cowboy Fast Draw Association's goal is to try and keep the guns, holsters, and clothing as true to form of the 1800's time period. So as guest, western clothing is encouraged. In fact, there will be an incentive for dressing the part (See Prizes below)!

<u>Safety</u>

The primary goal of the Association is safety. Each competitor is assisted by a trained person to maintain safety standards and the match is overseen by a Range Master. Their motto is "Safety First, Fun Second, Competition Third!"

The Town of Pagosa Springs will be presenting prizes for Winning Team, Best Individual Time, Best Western Costume.
