Long Term Real GDP Growth Trend


Percent Change 20-Year Quarterly Moving Average



Quarterly Real GDP








National Employment


Labor Force Participation Rate

By Gender



National by Age Cohort



National by Educational Attainment, Population 25 and Over, Jan 2017






Business Cycle





Employment Losses and Recovery










State Employment Growth






Revised Year-over-Year Percentage Change















Concentration of Industry Employment

Concentration of Industry Output




Average Annual Growth, 1990–2015

















Share of Value Added
