^{*}Park City: Of course, our code abilities vary from Colorado, but we share the same common denominator, which is trying to provide safe rental properties that are reasonably affordable. Yes, our Code requires licensing and inspections for nightly rentals (any rental for 30 days or less). Properties must meet minimum life safety standards consistent with the International Building Code. Long term rentals (any rental more than 30 days are not required to be licensed or inspected. Building Department- We have a Business License Inspector who inspects the nightly rental properties before they can be licensed and Code Enforcement (also in Building Dept) that enforces licensing violations. We do not have regulations/enforcement for long term rentals other than zoning restrictions.

^{**}Frisco: The Town of Frisco does not do "tenant protection" as such. The TOF protects inhabitants through the 2012, IBC, 2012 IRC, 2012 International Fire Code, 2014 National Electric Code, 1997 Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, and the 1997 Uniform Code for Building Conservation.
