Stilson Park & Ride

The Stilson intercept parking lot began operation in 2003, as a planned TDM strategy to reduce winter traffic to and from Teton Village. Today, an average of 275 cars park at Stilson daily in winter, where drivers board free START Buses and shuttles to Teton Village.

START Transit Facility

Southern Teton Area Rapid Transit (START) is a public bus service provided by Town of Jackson and Teton County. Opened in 2014, the START Transit Facility Phase 1 was funded by \$11.4M federal funding (including a TIGER Grant), \$1M state funding and \$8.35M local funding.

Teton County Search and Rescue Facility
