**Burned down in 1898**

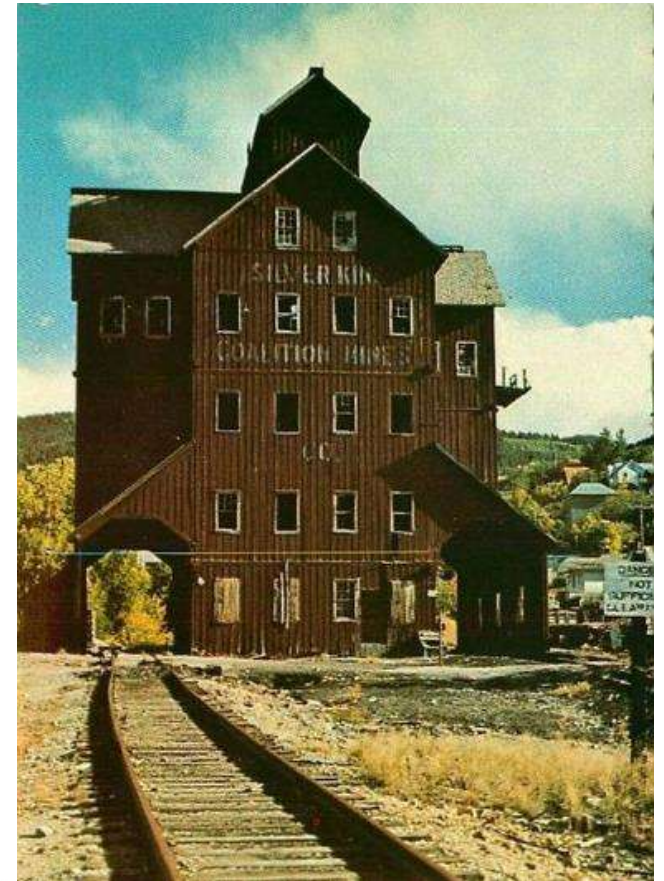


# Park City by the Numbers
